

Policies on software source code in Academia

Making software source code available, with the option of modifying, reusing and disseminating it, is a major requirement to ensure the reproducibility of scientific findings and to support the creation and sharing of knowledge, in keeping with the open science ethos.

Open Scientific knowledge [includes] open source software: source code must be included in the software release and made available on openly accessible repositories




